DU classes resume today

All classes of the Dhaka University will resume today (Sunday) after 73 days of closure, reports BSS.

Residential halls of the university reopened on September 22 amid tight security.

On July 15, the university was closed sine die and students were asked to vacate their halls following a clash between two rival student organisations on the campus in which three persons including two students were killed.

* Meanwhile, all necessary measures have taken by the authorities to hold classes smoothly.

A joint rally of teachers, students and employees of the university will be held today (Sunday) in support of maintaining a congenial academic atmosphere on the campus. To be organised by the Dhaka University Education Environment Committee, the gathering will be addressed by the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Abdul Mannan.

After the rally, a silent procession will be brought out from the Aparajeya Bangla to pay homage to the memories of Wadud Halim, Asad Ahmed Munna and Abdur Rahim, victims of July 14 and 15 incidents on the campus.

All classes and offices of the university will remain suspended from 11 a.m. to 1-30 p.m. on the occasion.
