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DU opens today

Classes of Dhaka University will resume today (Sunday) after a 73-day closure. The residential halls were reopened on September 22 amid tight security and examinations commenced on September 24.

Dhaka University was closed since the and residential students were asked to vacate the halls on July 15 following a series of bloody clashes between two student organisations. Two students and one rickshaw puller were killed in the clashes.

Prof. Abdul Mannan, Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University will address a gathering in front of the Arts Faculty building at

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around 11 a.m. today (Sunday) to express determination to free the campus from terrorism and restore normal academic atmosphere.

The gathering will be followed by a joint silent procession of the teachers, students, officers and employees of the university from the "Aparajayabangla" in front of the Arts Faculty building at 11.30 a.m.

The procession will be brought out to pay homage to the memory of late Wadud Halim, Asad Ahmed Munna and Abdur Rahim, victims of July 14 and 15 clashes on the campus.

There will be no classes today (Sunday) between 11 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. Offices of the University will also remain closed during the period to facilitate teachers, students and officials to participate in the gathering and the procession.

All teachers, students, officers and students have been requested to attend the silent procession, says a University press release.

The University will, however, remain open only for two days before an 8-day vacation on the

occasions of Durga Puja, Lankhi Puja and autumn vacation which will start on September 29. The classes will again resume on October 7.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Chhatra League (Shahabuddin), Chhatra League (Aziz) and Chhatra League (Jalil) in separate statements on Saturday called upon all teachers, students, officers and employees of Dhaka University to build united resistance against all kinds of terrorism to ensure healthy academic atmosphere on the campus.

Code of conduct for students at RU

RAJSHAHI, Sept 26: A code of conduct for the students to ensure the congenial academic environment in Rajshahi University campus was announced today at a tripartite meeting of Rajshahi University teachers, employees, student leaders and representatives of all political parties.

Presided over by the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. M A Raquib, the meeting unanimously accepted the code of conduct passed by the Rajshahi University syndicate on September 24. The main points of the code of conduct were as follows: (1) No student will be allowed to carry or use or keep or sell arms and drugs within the campus; (2) Rajshahi Uni-

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versity authority may call law-enforcing agencies in the campus for any unlawful act; (3) no unsocial activity will be allowed in the campus; (4) processions and slogans are prohibited during the class hours near class rooms; (5) seats will be allotted in the residential halls on the basis of merit.

A 37-member Rajshahi University Academic-Environment Council has been formed with the Vice Chancellor as President.
