## DU will remain open

Tension was prevailing in Dhaka University campus on Saturday following armed clash that took place on Friday between two rival groups of students. Though there was no fresh violence on the day blank shots and bomb explosions were heard in the morning and evening.

Classes were held as usual but presence of students were not satisfactory. Scheduled Honours final and Master's degree final examinations have been postponed for an indefinite period.

Both Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal, Pro-JSD (Inu) Chhatra League and Pro-Awami League student organisations brought out separate processions on the campus on Saturday. The students were shouting against

## Agri. varsity closed sine die

Bangladesh Agricultural University has been closed for an indefinite period on Friday night following an armed clash between two rival groups of students. The residential students were asked to vacate the halls by 6 p.m. on Saturday.

The Syndicate of the university in an emergency meeting on Friday took the decision. The scheduled examinations were postponed.

The clash ensued when a group of students mercilessly beat up one Badsha a leader of the pro-Awami League Chhatra League. Later a number of outsiders attacked the residential hall with deadly weapons. The varsity students countered them equally. However none was injured in the clash.
