

No date to re-open DU fixed as yet

The top functionaries of the Dhaka University in their bid to resume classes met under the chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. M.A. Mannan on Thursday.

The meeting discussed the recommendations made by the Academic Council and Environment Council regarding reopening of the University.

Although the meeting did not announce any specific date for the reopening of the University it laid down rules for the resident students of the Halls. The rules will be strictly enforced.

The meeting has decided to allocate seat strictly in accordance with merit, the final year students will be required to hand over the seat to the Hall authority at the end of the examination. In the event of their failure to do so, their results will be kept in abeyance, students residing at Halls without permission will have to vacate their seats. Students taking new course at the end of their Master degree will not be allowed accommodation at the Halls.

The University will enforce the system of roll call at the Halls. This will be done five days a week.

The meeting will seek police help to evict non-students from halls, to prevent any breach of peace and to mop up arms.

The University went into an unscheduled closure on July 15 following violent clashes on the campus.
