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## 111 more MPs condemn Monday's varsity incident

A group of 111 MPs in a joint statement on Wednesday demanded exemplary punishment to those responsible for launching an attack on Mrs Hasna Moudud, MP at the Dhaka University campus on June 20, reports BSS.

The MPs condemned the "fascistic and cowardly attack" on Mrs Moudud, a former teacher and a Senate member of the university.

The MPs called upon the government to take drastic measure to make the campus free of arms. They also demanded to make a review of the Dhaka University Ordinance of 1971 and bring about necessary amendments with a view to making it more effective.

The MPs also demanded immediate expulsion of those teachers who had no requisite

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qualifications to be appointed, the Members of Parliament also demanded of the government to wipe out "party politics" and expel non-students from the campus.

The statement also demanded suspension of all government grants to the university subject to the materialisation of the demands made by them for restoring a congenial atmosphere in the campus.

Narrating the pitiable condition in the Dhaka University, the Members of Parliament remarked that the entire university was now the hostage of a section of so-called students, who were being guided by the so-called teachers.

There was no security of life for the general students and everything is being done there by use of guns, they regretted.

Meanwhile President and General Secretary of the Jatiya Jubo Sanghati Sheikh Shahidul Islam, MP and Saifur Rahman MP, respectively on Wednesday condemned the Dhaka University incident of June 20, involving Begum Hasna Moudud MP.

university campus and tarnishing the image of majority peace loving students." Such a incident is shameful in the highest seat of education" they said.

Sheikh Shahid, who is also the Works Minister and Saifur Rahman also called upon the peace loving students, university authority and people in general to punish those culprits and resist their activities.
