

Admission to DU Honours courses from Feb 23

Dhaka University will soon start admission of freshers into the honours courses (1987-88) under the faculties of arts, social science, law, commerce, science and biological sciences.

Detailed information regarding the admission will be announced through newspapers.

Preliminary application forms will be available at the offices 'kha', 'ga' and 'gha' units from February 23 to March 22.

Candidates who passed the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examination in 1986 and 1987 and obtained minimum two second divisions or first division in the HSC, third division in the SSC examinations and secured at least 45 per cent marks in concerned subjects may apply for admission to the departments under 'kha' and 'ga' units.

Those who obtained minimum 50 per cent marks in concerned subjects and a total of 1150 marks in HSC and SSC examinations will be eligible to apply for the departments in the faculties of science and biological sciences, under 'ka' unit.

Only those who got 45 per cent marks in Bangla and English at the HSC level can apply for admission to the departments under 'gha' unit, according to the announcement.

The 'kha' unit covers the departments under the faculties of arts and social sciences and the 'ga' unit the departments under the faculty of commerce. The 'gha' unit is meant for those students who would get admitted to the science and biological science faculties with the intention of changing department subsequently.

Each year around 2,500 stu-

Fresh time table for the examination will be announced in due course.

ADJUSTMENT
