Chhatra Jote boycotts meet on Ekushey at DU VC's house

The Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal-led Sangrami Chhatra Jote has boycotted a meeting held at the residence of Dhaka University Vice-Chancellor Prof Abdul Mannan to finalise the programme of February 21 saying that the combine cannot be a party to any decision taken in presence of the controversial people.

In an open letter to the university authorities, Asaduzzaman Ripon, President of JCD, said they were unable to attend the meeting because of the presence of the VC and the Proctor, both of whom played partisan role during the incidents concerning the DUCSU elections.

Accusing the VC and the Proctor of their failure to ensure safety and security of the students and the teachers alike they demanded resignation of both of them. They

 brought a host of allegations against them. These are: Failure to provide security to students and teachers during the brutal attack on the girl students, firing on the Mohsin Hall's provost and the teachers of the university, attacks and vandalism at Mohsin Hall, S.M. Hall, Zahurul Huq Hall and Jagannath Hall, killing of an outsider at the campus, their partisan role during the elections of DUCSU and halls. In the light of these and on the question of peace and tradition of the university we demand that they should step down," he added.

However, he said, "we have no allegation against the officials of DUCSU or the CSAC. On the question of peace and harmony in the campus we have no objection to hold discussions and arrive at a decision as we have done in the past excepting with those who are controversial", Mr Ripon said.

He further said Shaheed Minar and Ekushey February are a matter of pride for the nation. In this regard we want to point out that presence of any person at the Shaheed Minar who is controversial, who is an associate of the autocratic Government and who opposed the Independence War could create resentment in observance of the sacred day and conducting its ceremonies, he pointed out.
