DU campus tense despite decision to hold union polls

Though the University authorities have decided to hold the Dhaka University Central Students Union (DUCSU) and hall union polls on February 8, the situation on the campus appears not to be peaceful.

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) which split after killing of Bazlur Rahman Khan Shahid, was united again on Tuesday on one point JCD said it would not take part in the polls until the expulsion order on its nine members is withdrawn. However, the central leaders of the party are interested to participate in

the election. But an insider of the organisation told this correspondent that they were under pressure of the stalwarts to participate in the polls.

A source closed to the CSAC informed this correspondent they would meet this evening at the residence of a former student leader to chalk out the strategy and possibilities of the DUCSU election.
