## DUCSU memo to Home Secretary

A delegation of the Dhaka University Central Students Union (DUCSU) yesterday submitted a memorandum to the Home Secretary urging him to take action against whom they called terrorists in the university campus in order to restore a healthy atmosphere.

It was part of DUCSU's fortnight-long programme, which began on August 5, against campus violence.

The memorandum held responsible the armed miscreants in the guise of students for the DU campus violence since long. The university is almost lacking a congenial atmosphere.

The memorandum says, Those terrorists with firearms often attack teachers, students and staff of the university in the areas of residential halls and faculty buildings. These elements are seen active despite police guard in the campus. The law enforcing agencies sometimes raid the halls and recover lathis, knives etc in the name of recovering arms. Saying that such acts of the authorities concerned are not effective for freeing the campus from arms, the memorandum says, the sufferings of the students have not yet come to an end. It demands of the Government to bring back congenial atmosphere in the DU campus by arresting and trial of the persons responsible.

The DUCSU delegates included: Mahabubul Haq Litu, acting vice-president, Mushtaq Hossain, general secretary, Nasir-ud-Doza, assistant general secretary and other DUCSU office-bearers Shafiqul Alam Barkat, Yaseen Alpona, Mohiuddin Siddiqy, Matiur Rahman Babul, Obiduzzaman Chan and Mosh-taq Alam Tulu.

Earlier, two separate rallies were held—one in the DU

campus and another in front of the Home Ministry. Addressing the DU campus rally Hossain called upon the DU Syndicate to take immediate steps for publishing the report of the committee probing the post-DUCSU election violence in the campus and taking action against the persons responsible
