



DUCSU's call to meet 28-point by Sept 9

The Dhaka University Central Students Union (DUCSU) yesterday called upon the university authorities to meet its 28-point charter of demands by September 9, reports BSS.

Addressing a rally organised on the last day of DUCSU's fortnight-long programme to protest against violence in the campus, at the foot of Aparajaeya Bangla, DUCSU General Secretary Mushtaq Hossain urged all concerned to come forward to help curb violence on the campus.

He strongly demanded that the authorities take stern action against those who had attacked a women students' procession on February 9 and said that failing this, the university authorities must resign.

The charter of demands includes curbing violence in the campus, taking steps to remove session-jam, construction of more residential halls, increasing the number of buses and stipends.

Later, a procession led by present and former DUCSU leaders paraded the campus and dispersed at the Jatiya Press Club.
