

Four DU students stabbed on campus

Four students of Dhaka University reportedly belonging to pro-JSD (Inu) Chhatra League (M-N) received serious stab injuries on Thursday following an intra-party conflict, witnesses said, reports UNB.

The injured students are: Farid Ahmed, resident of Surjasen Hall, Ratan Datta, of the Library Science Department, Nitya Gopal Tutu of the Sanskrit Department and Nikhal Dutta also of the Sanskrit Department. The last three are residents of Jagannath Hall.

They were rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where all of them were given several stitches.

Campus sources said, the victims were attacked by a group of seven to eight armed youngmen at their respective rooms on Thursday morning in the Surjasen and Jagannath Halls.

Sources close to Chhatra League (M-N) said the attack was a follow-up of a discord among the workers about selection of new leadership of the Dhaka University unit.

Meanwhile, in another incident two Shibir workers were allegedly manhandled by some students at about 1 p.m. at the Arts Faculty Building, sources said.

One-month detention for 5 Shibir leaders

Another report adds: Five of the arrested Shibir leaders and workers of its Dhaka Alia Madrasha unit have been given one month detention.

Shibir sources said the detained Shibir activists are Alia Madrasha unit President Abu Saeed, Secretary Abdus Sabur, Mahmud, Mosharref Hossain and Sanaullah.

Eighty-three Shibir leaders and workers of the unit were arrested in connection with a case lodged with Lalbagh Thana following clashes between the Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal and the Shibir activists August 13 night.

Of the arrested, 29 were released by the court on bail yesterday while 41 were released earlier.
