DU classes held peacefully

Permanent police camp ruled out

The Dhaka University authorities in a statement on Saturday ruled out the possibility of allowing "permanent police camp" in the university campus.

They said that police had been deployed in the university campus to uproot the armed hoodlums for good and ensure security of the teachers, students, officers and employees of the university. No decision to allow a permanent police camp in the university campus was taken, the statement said.

Meanwhile, the Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) brought out a procession in the campus on Saturday protesting against what they termed as "decision to allow permanent police

camp in the university."

The procession was followed by a rally in front of the DUCSU building. The JCD leaders Rana Shikder, Khairul Ahsan Ratan and Jahangir Alam addressed the rally.

The speakers demanded immediate release of all student detenus including the JCD leader Sanaul Huq Niru.

The campus was peaceful on Saturday amid heavy police guard. Classes were held normally.
