## Strike observed at DU

Students of the Dhaka-University on Thursday abstained from classes in response to a call for strike to protest Thursday night's armed attack on Bangabandhu's residence where Sheikh Hasina was staying, reports UNB.

Some Masters degree and subsidiary examinations could not be held although scheduled examinations had been kept out of the purview of the stirke called by the Bangladesh Chhatra League (H-A).

A rally was held in the Dhaka University campus Thursday at 11.45 a.m. which was addressed by BCL President Habibur Rahman Habib and General secretary Ashim Kumar Ukil.

Speakers at the rally blamed the Freedom Party for the attack and termed it as an act of terrorism on the democratic forces.

The self-confessed killers of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman were exempted from trial by the previous regime and politically rehabilitated by the present regime to perpetrate similar crimes on his daughter," they alleged.

The BCL leaders demanded inquiry into the incident and punishment to those responsible for the attack.

They called upon the followers of Sheikh Mujib to launch a resolute struggle against the "autocratic" regime to establish an exploitation-free society.
