Tension in DU

A tense situation was prevailing in the Dhaka University campus Tuesday as the pro-Awami League Chhatra League activists were chased by armed youngmen, alleged to be JCD workers, reports UNB.

The Chhatra League leaders and workers, were chased but of the Madhu's Canteen where they gathered after a rally on the campus. Chhatra League President Habibur Rahman Habibi addressing the rally reportedly made some adverse remarks on the nine expelled students belonging to the pro-BNP Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD).

The incident created panic among the students who were seen running helter skelter for safety.

Regular classes and scheduled ex-

The leaders of the JCD-led Sangrami Chhatra Jote (SCJ), in a rally after the incident, accused the BCL of trying to mislead the movement against Jamaat-Shibir, which has been spearheaded by the newly-formed alliance of 22 student organisations.

They said the BCL was solely responsible for creating the tense situation today by resorting to invectives and lies about the expelled JCD leaders.

The Central Students Action Committee (CSAC), which held a counter-rally shortly afterwards, apprehended eruption of fresh violence as, it said, the University authorities had failed to dislodge the "expelled armed hooligans" from the residential halls.

CSAC leaders condemned, what they called, armed attack on Chhatra League President and blamed some expelled students for the attack.

The DUCSU leaders, who also addressed the CSAC rally, urged the concerned authorities to take immediate action against the "vandals trying to destroy the academic atmosphere on the campus."
