

Injunction on varsity senate session goes

DHAKA, April 10 (UNB) : The injunction order on holding of Dhaka University Senate session has been set aside by a court order and the authorities are now free to hold it, official sources today said.

The injunction was set aside by the District Judge's Court here on April 7 nullifying the order of the 4th Sub-Judge court of Dhaka which suspended the annual session of the University's 5th Senate on June 27 last year.

The Senate, elected in October 1988, could not go for its session for more than one and

a half years due to the injunction order following controversy over the system of electing 25 representatives from the registered graduates.

Two registered graduates, A K M. Shahidullah and A K M. Ali Reza, had lodged the case saying that the Senate session could not be held without electing their representatives.

Vice Chancellor Prof M. Moniruzzaman Miah told UNB tonight that the session would be called immediately, after receiving formal court order in this regard.

Prof Miah hoped that the postponed session of the 5th Senate might be held immediately after the Ramzan and the Eid-ul-Fitr.

He, however, maintained that all administrative and other activities of the university would be run on democratic process and said the Senate would play its role for smooth functioning of the campus.

The Vice Chancellor expected that everyone would play active and positive role in electing a three-member panel for appointing a regular VC of the university, scheduled for June next.
