

## Injunction on varsity senate session goes

- DHAKA, April 10 (UNB): The injunction order on holding of Dhaka University Senate session has been set aside by a court order and the authorities are now free to hold it, official sources today said.

The injunction was set aside by the District Judge's Court here on April 7 nulifying the crder of the 4th Sub-Judge University's 5th Senate on June 27 last year.
