

Body taken to Magura Killing of Liton condemned

The body of Alamgir Kabir Liton, a first part M.A. student, department of Library Science of Dhaka University, who was shot dead at Surya Sen Hall on Sunday night was sent to his home town Magura on Monday. He was 25.

Liton was killed at Room Number 369, which was allotted to Alauddin, an activist of Pro-Awami League Chhatra League (H-A). Liton did not belong to any student organisation, according to resident students of the hall. Alauddin was not available at his room after the incident, according to a police source.

Most of the time Liton used to stay in the solitary room where he was killed leaving his own Room Number 308 on the same floor. According to a report Liton was talking to some of his friends when the incident took place. Marks of

several bullet holes were found on the wall of Room Number 369. It was a single-seat room.

Liton was preparing for appearing at the Bangladesh Civil Service Examination and many resident students told this correspondent that Liton remained busy with his studies.

His father Mr. Abdul Kuddus is the Vice-Principal of Magura Government College. Liton, the eldest of his seven children five daughters and two sons. After the incident Liton was taken to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where the attending doctors tried frantically to save his life. He was bleeding profusely. The bullet fired from a point blank range pierced through his head and hit the wall.

The body of Liton was handed over to his relative on Monday

morning after post mortem.

Different student organisations brought out processions on the campus condemning terrorism and demanding punishment to the killer of Liton. It may be mentioned here that three months ago Arif, a brilliant student of the Department of Finance of Dhaka University was shot dead while he was attending a students meeting at S.M. Hall.

Immediately after the killing of Liton policemen went to Surya Sen Hall and made a search in the room and recovered some spent shells of the bullets.

The Officer-in-Charge of Ramna Thana told this correspondent at the spot that none was arrested and investigation was in progress. Another police officials viewed it was a case of murder.

The Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University in a statement expressed grief at the gruesome murder of Liton. He urged the government to conduct thorough investigation with the participation of Criminal Investigation Department (CID) to unearth the truth behind the secret killing.
