The university was closed on July 30 and the resident students were asked to vacate their halls following a gunbattle between pro-BNP Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) and Awami League backed Chhatra League (A-A).

Only a small number of students returned to their halls yesterday. The university authorities had earlier announced that identity of the students would be checked at the hall gates to prevent the entry of outsiders and armed holligans. But no measure in this regard was found at the hall gates.

When contacted, Vice-Chancellor Prof. Maniruzzaman Miah said that police were not deployed near the halls since he thought it would not give a lossing solution to the problem.

An end to campus violence was depend on the attitude of the student bodies because the problem was a political one, especially for Dhaka University, he added.
