## DU Senate election campaign geared up

As the count down began, candidates vying for the 25 Registered Graduate representatives in the Dhaka University Senate elections scheduled for June 14-15, have further accelerated their campaign.

Candidates under the banners of two panels — Jatiyatabadi Oikya Parishad (JOP) and Ganotantrik Oikya Parishad (GOP) have further geared up their campaign as the date for the elections is knocking at the door.

The JOP is backed by BNP and its like minded political parties while GOP is supported by the ruling Awami League and some other left leaning parties.

Sources said both the panels are now holding separate projection meetings in city and other parts of the country almost everyday. Candidates are also making contact individually with the voters through appearing at the door step of homes or telephone.

The contesting candidates are mainly introducing themselves from their respective political identity, but many were seen trying to influence the voters through applying all possi-
