## Barisal Medical college closed sine die Our Correspondent

BARISAL, July 21:—Barisal, Sher-e-Bangla Medical College has been declared closed sine die today (Saturday) following attack allegedly by a group of BNP armed cadres on medial college hostel and also internee doctors' hostel on Friday night.

According to eyewitnesses, a group of BNP armed cadres attacked medical college hospital on Friday night and damaged at least ten rooms of internee doctors. The

ten rooms of internee doctors. The cadres also manhandled the col-lege students including the Vice President of the college students union injuring at least ten others. The Vice President of the college student union and three others were admitted to the college hospital with serious injures.

The college academic council in an emergency meeting today declared the closure of the college



sine die. The students of the college were directed to leave the

lege were directed to leave the hostel latest by 5 p.m. today.

The BNP workers today also ransacked four Awami League offices at Taliali Mahaba Zia Sarak and Batanajin the fown At least six persons were injured in the incidents.

UNB reports adds Campus sources said a group of armed

sources said a group of armed outsiders, belonging to BNP backed Chhatra Dal, attacked the internee hostel Friday midnight.

They beat up BCL college unit general secretary Mostafizur Rahman Milon and activist Tuhin. Mostafizur

Later, they attacked College Students: Union VP Sanjay, Kar near hostel No.2, and injured him seriously sparking off strong pro-

seriously sparking off, strong protests by the BCL workers.
Following the incident, Chhatra League workers held a protest rally this (Saturday) morning and chased ICD activists. They beat up Shibir activist Tushar and ICD's Reza and Jewel

Sarbadaliya Chhatra Oikya also brought out a procession and ransacked operation theatre in the energency department in the club Shandhani office and hospital colors
