



SSC, Dakhil exams Over 4000 expelled on 3rd day

Over 4,000 examinees were expelled on the third day of Secondary School Certificate (SSC) and Dakhil examinations on Monday for adopting unfair means in the exams.

Bangla 1st paper examination was held on the day under seven education boards and the Madrasah board of the country.

Some 30 teachers were also expelled on the day on charge of assisting the examinees in copying.

Of the total expelled students, highest 1649 were expelled from Rajshahi Board, 380 from Dhaka board, 450 from Comilla Board, 105 from Jessore Board, 261 from Chittagong Board, 150 from Barisal Board, 43 from Sylhet Board and 936 from Madrasah Education board.

Highest seventeen teachers and navigators were expelled from Rajshahi Board followed by seven from Jessore Board. The rest teachers were expelled from other boards.

With Monday's expulsion some 6,000 students were expelled in first three days of ongoing SSC examinations.

Authorities of Jessore education board requested the Deputy Commissioner (DC) of Kushtia to deploy paramilitary BDR personnel in four centres of Daulatpur Upazila of Kushtia on Monday following reports of massive copying and capturing of those examination centres by terrorists.

The board authorities also directed the secretaries of the respective centre secretaries to cancel their centres if terrorism and adoption of unfair means is reported further. The four centres are Daulatpur High School centres, Khan Mathurapur centre, Philip Nagar centre and Bar

Gangdia centre.
