



5800 SSC examinee expelled on 2nd day

About 5800 examinees were expelled on the second day of Secondary School Certificate (SSC) and Dhakil examinations on Sunday adopting unfair means in the examinations.

English Second-paper examinations were held on the day under seven Education Boards and the Madrasah Board of the country.

Twenty-three teachers and invigilators were also expelled on the on charge of assisting the examinees in copying.

Of the total expelled students, 803 face expulsion from Dh Board, 2975 from Rajshahi Board, 815 from Comilla Board, 413 from Jessore Board, 292 from Chittagong Board, 305 from Barisal Board and 103 from Sylhet Board.

Highest seventeen teachers and invigilators were expelled from Rajshahi Board while the rest from other boards.

On the first day of the examinations over 6,000 SSC and Dhakil examinees were expelled on charge of adopting unfair means in the examinations. Thirteen teachers were also expelled for assisting students in copying.

Our Comilla correspondent adds: The second day of SSC examinations held in six districts under Comilla Board amid tight security and massive copying in some centres of Comilla and Feni districts.

A total of 815 examinees—733 SSC examinees and 82 Dhakil examinees—were expelled from different centres under the board on charge of copying.

Three invigilators were expelled during the examinations as they were found assisting examinees in copying. Besides, a Madrasah teacher and a youth were arrested by police from two centres when they were supplying copies to the examinees.

Following vigilance team's reports of massive copying by the examinees at Fulgazi Pilot High School in Feni district and Amratoli High School and Gunabati High School in Comilla district, the board authorities requested the DCs of respective districts to deploy additional forces at the centres. The authorities have also given directives to the secretaries of the centres to cancel the examination centres if adoption of unfair means is reported further.

This year a total of 8,83,345 examinees are appearing in the SSC examinations at 853 centres at home and abroad while some 1,51,851 Dhakil examinees at 350 centres across the country.
