

The newly installed Sylhet ucation Board took first public iminations by arranging the C Examinations-2001 in March t. The HSC Examinations-2001 ieduled to began on May 10 is second public examination der the Sylhet Education Board. Accoding to Sylhet Education and sources, a total of 17,176 indidates, including 10349 male d 6,827 female students, will sit the HSC. Examinations this ar under Sylhet Board. :From Our Correspondent candidates will sit for the examination from Moulvibazar district while 8119 candidates from Sylhet, 2876 candidates from Hobigong and 2540 candidates from Sunamgong district.

Barisal Board

BSS adds: Barisal Education Board authorities held a number of meetings at different district headquarters with the teachers, guardians and elite for creating public awareness against copying in the examination halls in the coming HSC Examinations from May 10, being held for the first

time under this Board.

Among others, Prof Abdus Salam, Chairman of the Board, Prof. Sachin Majumder, Secretary, Prof. Gopal Chandra Shaha, Controller, and Prof. Amjad Hossain, Inspector of Colleges, were present in the meetings.

The Board authorities have made elaborate preparations to hold the examinations in a free, fair and peaceful atmosphere. They also took some decisions in

this connection.

According to the decisions, the students will not sit at the examinations in the colleges where they studied. The students of one college will sit for the examinations

at a different college or centre.

The teachers of a college centre will not be given invigilation duty in the same centre where they are serving. Similarly, the teachers of a particular college centre will not be given invigilation duty in a centre where the students of their college will sit. Two examinees will sit on one bench.

If the number of invigilators of in examination centre falls short, qualified teachers from a nearby high school or government offi-rials could be engaged for the nvigilation duties, Board sources

Subject-based teachers will not be given invigilation duties on the day of examination of those subjects.

A total of 34,085 students, including 13,850 women, will appear at the HSC Examinations this year under the Barisal Education Board. Some 73 mobile teams have been constituted with two to three teachers in a team for the smooth conducting of the examinations.
