Clashes on DU campus: seven students injured

Seven students of Dhaka University (DU) including two university correspondents were injured in separate clashes on the campus on Sunday.

The injured are Anu Anwar, university correspondent of the Daily Prothom Alo, Zahedur Rahman Arman, university correspondent of Daily Dinkal and activists of Bangladesh Chhatra.

League (BCL) Sima Islam, Sumon, Newaz, Utpal and Rizvi.

A group of JCD activists of Jashimuddin Hall led by joint-secretary Tuhin and activists Lalin and Sabuj attacked Anu Anwar at the domitory at early hours on Sunday leaving him seriously injured.

In another incident a group of BCL activists of Surya Sen Hall led by Saeed and Mustaq beaten up Zahedur Rahman in front of Central Library at about 1.00pm on Sunday.

ivists led by Delwar Hossain, ormer General Secretary of DU unit of BCI, beaten up indiscriminately Sima, Secretary of Rokeya Hall unit of BCL and Utpal of Jagannath Hall in front of central Library. Later, they also attacked Newaz and Sumon of Sargent Zahurul Haq Hall in fromt of DUCSU Building leaving them serious injured. They were admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH).

Later, police arrested Md. Jamal Uddin, a 3rd year student of the Department of History of Jagannath University (JU).

Teachers and students of Mass Communication and Journalism (MCI) brought out a silent rally on the DU campus in protest of attacked on university correspondent

The Dhaka University Journalist Association (DUJA) on Sunday at a general meeting decided to make a 'silent rally' on the campus and will stage a demonstration at the foot of Aparajeya Bangla today (Monday) in protest against the attacked on journalists.

Later, the members of DUJA met with DU Vice-chancellor and requested him to take urgent steps against those who were allegedly involved in the incidents. They gave the authorities a 72-hours ultimatum for action.
