

Pass percentage 72.78%, 20,136 secured GPA-5

# HSC results published

None pass from 41 colleges, madrasas

The results of the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) and its equivalent Alim and HSC business management (BM) examinations of 2009 under the country's ten education boards were published on Saturday showing a more than four percent fall in pass percentage of 72.78 compared to last year's average 76.19.

A total of 20,136 examinees -- 12,088 male and 8,048 female -- have secured the highest Grade Point Average (GPA)-5, a fall by 1,909 from last year's 22,045. Of the total GPA-5 achievers, 18,222 are from the eight general education boards while 1,914 from the Madrasah and Technical education boards.

It is followed by 9,450 won GPA-5 from Dhaka Board, 2,229 from Rajshahi Board, 601 from Comilla Board, 2,093 from Jessore Board, 1,448 from Chittagong Board, 439 from Sylhet Board, 574 from Barisal Board, 1,894 from Madrasa Board and 20 from Technical Education Board.

The overall results showed a little fall in both the pass percentage and the number of top-graders (GPA-5) over last year's marks.

Notre Dame College, Dhaka City College and

Viqarunnisa Noon College again turned out to be the top three colleges that are home to the highest number of GPA-5-holders of this year's examinations under ten education boards.

Notre Dame College clinched the credit of the highest number of GPA-5 scorer with 1,207 students

Dhaka Board with GPA-5 achievers are Dhaka Commerce College (409 GPA-5), Bir Shreshtha Noor Mohammad Rifles Public School and College (409), Ideal School and College, Motijheel (393), Dhaka College (359), Holy Cross College (339), Rajuk Uttara Model School and College (317), Milestone Col-

cessful in this year HSC and equivalent examinations.

The board-wise numbers of such institutions are Dhaka Board- 4, Rajshahi-4, Jessore-3, Barisal-2, Madrasa Board-16 and Technical Board-4. As per statistics, the number of colleges and madrasas with zero results was same in last two years. The year-wise number of colleges and madrasas with zero results were as follows 2003-300, 2004-268, 2005-131, 2006-70, 2007-60 and 2008-41 and 2009-41.

About 4.42 lakh examinees out of 6.07 lakh including 3.33 lakh male and 2.74 lakh female came out successful in this year's HSC and its

equivalent exams from ten education boards which began on April 16 last. The percentages of pass for boys and girls are 73.64 and 71.73 respectively against 76.69 and 75.57 of last year.

The pass rate in the HSC examinations this year under eight general education boards stands at 70.43 percent, down from the last year's 74.85 percent.

Madrasah Education Board showed the highest pass rate, for its Alim exams, while the newly formed Dinajpur Board had the lowest HSC pass rate of 55.90 per-

cent. The Technical Board saw the second highest pass rate at 80.72 percent pass, though it marked a drop from 81.27 percent last year followed by Dhaka Board is 71.53, Rajshahi 70.47, Comilla 66.99, Jessore 76.77, Chittagong 76.31, Barisal 67.20, Sylhet 73.96 and Dinajpur 55.90 percent. The 100% pass-wise best school is Motijheel Ideal School and College.

 passed Under the Madrasa Board and 48,278 out of 59,792 students came out successful in Business Management examinations under Technical Education Board.  
 For the first time, the results of one of the most important public examinations were published after only 58 days of the examinations. Education Minister Nurul Islam Naheed said at a news conference at the secretariat on Saturday.  
 Expressing satisfaction over this year's HSC results, education minister said stern action against cheating in the public examinations has helped to make the students more attentive to study, which has been key to achieving good results.  
 Among others, Secretary of Education Ministry Syed Ataur Rahman, Chairman of 10 education boards, and officials of education ministries and boards were present.  
 Earlier, minister Nurul Islam Naheed formally handed over the results to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at her official residence Jamuna in the noon. Later, the Prime Minister opened the results by clicking on the internet in her laptop.  
 records has increased to 765 from last year's 674, while the number of colleges with zero pass remain unchanged at 41.  
 Like previous year, colleges in urban areas, particularly those in metropolitan cities, dominated in the GPA-5 category and institutions with hundred percent pass rate. In Dhaka Board, 1,09,060 students out of 1,52,470 examinees passed the exams with the pass percentage of 71.53 against 82.37 of last year. As many as 41,498 students appeared in the examinations under Chittagong Board and of them 31,668 have passed making a percentage of 76.31 against 67.96 of last year.  
 Following them 52,339 out of 74,274 candidates came out successful under Rajshahi Board with a pass percentage of 70.47. Some 57,713 out of 73,284 students passed Under Jessore Board, 27,598 examinees out of 41,199 passed Under Comilla Board, 19,972 out of 29,720 candidates passed under Barisal Board, 13,413 out of 18,136 students came out successful Under Sylhet Board, 32,722 out of 58,541 students Under Dinajpur Board, 49,626 out of 58,978 Alim examinees
