\$ 696,000 Dutch grant for BRAC University

The Netherlands Development Cooperation Programme will provide fund to the Institute for Educational Development of BRAC Jniversity (BU-IED) under an igreement between BRAC and the Royal Netherlands Embassy signed recently, says BSS.

The Dutch contribution will be JS\$ 696,000 for an initial period of wo years, a Press release said in Dhaka on Wednesday.

This support will enable BU-ED to carry out its core activities in the field of primary and secontary education, with a focus on improving learning outcomes, cacher development and education research. ion résearch.

The programme will be co-unded by the Royal Norwegian embassy and Swiss Development Cooperation (SDC).

The agreement was signed by app, van der Zeeuw, Charge d' Affaires of the Royal Netherlands imbassy, and Abdul-Muyeed Chowdhury, the Executive-Director of BRAC.

Currently, the Netherlands' assistance is focused on the followng sectors: basic education (inng sectors: basic education (in-cluding PEDP-II, BRAC Education Programme, CAMPE), health (in-cluding nutrition and reproduc-tive health), integrated water re-sources management, drinking water and sanitation, and rural electrification, with gender and governance as cross-cutting governance as hemes.
