

## 1U1 convocation held PM calls for befitting reply to provocations against Islam

GAZIPUR, Sept 18:-Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia today urged the Muslim Ummah to give a befitting reply to provocations against Islam through democratic advancement, socio-economic progress and supremacy in the fields of knowledge and science, reports BSS.

"For achieving these objectives, mutual understanding, solidarity and unity of the Islamic fraternity throughout the globe is urgently needed," she-said while address-ing the 20th convocation ceremony of the Islamic University of Technology (IUT), an educational institution run by the Organiza-tion of Islamic Conference (OIC), at the outskirts of the capital.
