Career Development Institute launched

An innovative career-oriented organisation named "Career Development Institute" (CDI) was launched at a ceremony in the National Press Club auditorium on Monday, reports BSS.

The CDI offers job-oriented training, entrepreneurship development training and counselling on higher education for educated youths.

Former Bangladesh ambassador to the United Nations Barrister Harun-Or-Rashid was present as the chief guest in the launching ceremony of CDI while Prof: Rahim B Talukder, Vice-Chancellor of Viqarunnesa University, Abdus Sabur Khan, President of Bangladesh Computer Society (BCS) and Mehbubur Rahman, President of Bangladesh Human Resources Centre were special guests. CDI President Quazi M. Ahmed presided over the function.

Speakers stressed appropriate training for educated youths for suiting the needs of the modern world and the country's development.

"Bangladesh is very rich in terms of human resources, but due to lack of appropriate training and exposure, a huge number of educated youths are not gainfully employed," they added.

The speakers said those who can become self-employed have also no clear sense of direction. As a result, frustration begins and gradually this frustration leads to social ills such as drug addiction and violence.

They appreciated the CDI and said against the backdrop of our society, for the first time in Bangladesh, the new organisation (CDI) was introduced for very practical and innovative purposes.
