After completing higher education Prof Kibria came back home and joined the Institute of Fine Arts of Dhaka University as a faculty member and taught the concept of Japanese beauty to his students. He also masterfully blended the Japanese beauty and the beauty of Bangladesh into his artworks. artworks.

Kibria was very successful in creating this unique fusion of two traditions and his contributions were acknowledged many times at home and abroad. He received the Ekushey Padak in 1983 and Independence Day Award in 1999 are the most coveted awards of Bangladesh. He also received two awards for his excellence as an artist during his days as a student of Fine Arts in Japan. These include the Starlem Award at the First Young Asian Artist Exhibition held in Tokyo in 1959 and a prize at the All Japan Print Exhiprize at the All Japan Print Exhibition in 1960.

Prof. Kibria will visit Japan from October 6 and will hold a solo art exhibition in Tokyo.
