Second convocation of BIT held Khaleda pledges to keep edn campus free from violence

GAZIPUR, Aug 29.— Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia here today (Thursday) said that her government did no longer want to see the names of the students stigmatised with terrorism, extortion and snatching of tenders.

Reiterating the pledge to make the campus free from violence to ensure congenial academic atmosphere, she announced that the government would fill the vacant posts in public services, including resumption of recruitment through civil service examinations, to create employment opportunities.

Besides, the government is considering induction of 15 days of internship for 10 meritorious stu-

dents of graduate and post-graduate levels at Bangabhaban, the Jatiya Sangsad and the Prime Minister's office as per recommendations from the respective institutions and the Education Ministry.

The Prime Minister's landmark declarations came at the 2nd Convocation of Bangladesh Institute of Technology (BIT), Dhaka, at its Gazipur campus. It is Begum Zia who, also Prime Minister, attended the 1st convocation of the institute in 1994.

"I will request the employers of different chambers, commercial and industrial institutions and bank, insurance and other private bodies to provide the students with part-time

employment opportunities during their vacations," Begum Zia said. This, she believed, would reduce pressure on the guardians through earning and help the students to achieve practical experience well before service life.

She further urged the talented youths and entrepreneurs to come forward in setting up industries of information and communications technology (ICT) sector, a choice of her own as well, to create self-employment opportunities. The government is planning introduction of Prime Minister's scholarship for the meritorious female students to facilitate ICT education for them, she informed the gathering.

The Prime Minister mentioned that her government had allocated the highest amount of money for education budget of Taka 6.810 crore, inclusive of Taka 100 crore for the ICT. "We want, you ensure the best utilisation of it," she told the students.

"If your government can work according the plans, no educated youths will remain employed in the near future, Inshallah (God willing)," she maintained.
