

They had been held incommunicado since their arrest. Police produced them before the court of Magistrate Ahsan Kabir on Saturday afternoon and sought to take them on seven days' remand. But the court 'granted four-day re-mand against both the teachers' and five-day remand against the JCD president.

Meanwhile, the whereabouts of the three teachers of Rajshahi University, also picked up late Thursday night from their residences, was not known yet.

The five university teachers were arrested a day after the government shut down sine die all the universities and colleges in six divisional cities following violent student movement Monday-Wednesday

The student protests that led to the death of a rickshawpuller in Rajshahi on Wednesday prompted the government to impose indefinite curfew.

Supreme Court lawyer Mahbubey Alam represented the two Dhaka University professors with the support of approximately 50 other lawyers.

Advocate Sanaullah Miah pleaded for Helal. The police read out the allegations against him and sought a 10-day remand, but the court granted five days.

Helal was installed as president of the new JCD leadership, which was revamped by Tarique Rah-man, BNP's senior joint secretary general who remains under detention on charges of corruption.

Helal faces allegations of creating panic in the public mind and obstructing traffic by setting tyres on fire in front of the Teacher-Student Centre, the vice chancellor's residence and F Rahman
