## Shifting exam venue *p* for AL meeting

A flagrant disregard for students' interests

T is absurd that a master's exam centre at a college in Gazipur was shifted without prior notice to let the local branch of Awami League hold a public meeting in the college premises. How would the college administration have ensured that none of the examinees had been left uninformed about the change beforehand? This is a flagrant disregard for students' interests that any educational institution is duty-bound to protect.

An educational institution is supposed to be used for educational purposes only. How could an outside meeting outweigh a crucial educational event like a public exam? Had the college been closed, the meeting could have been allowed to take place. It was not only open but also reserved for a crucial exam.
