

Govt firm to solve education problems

Chief Martial Law Administrator Lt. Gen. H M Ershad in his address to the nation on Sunday said that his government was capable of giving flawless solution to the long standing problems of the students.

The CMLA said that the government was aware of the demands of the students. "We are eager to know the subjects of their problems directly", he said.

Gen. Ershad said that it had been agreed on all hands that the present education system was unsuitable to meet the requirements of the country.

He pointed out that the Education Ministry had already prepared the outline to the proposed education system and that the process of eliciting public opinion on the proposed system was already on. He appealed to all to put forward their opinions on the question.

He hoped that all would respond positively, "because we want to firmly establish the legitimate right of education through the proposed education policy", he said.

The CMLA stressed that the government wanted to create a congenial and healthy atmosphere in the educational institu-

tions and solve their manifold problems.

He said that although he had heard the view points of many representative bodies in far flung areas of the country, "none had put forward the problems of the students" properly before him.

The CMLA also regretted that none had so far approached the government to inform it about the dearth of books in educational institutions and insufficient arrangements for sports and games. "The elected stud-

ents representatives have not mentioned that many seats of the residential halls have remained under the occupation of the old students as examinations were not held on schedule and that newly admitted students have been living a miserable life", he said.

"I have issued orders to hold all deferred examinations and take measures for publication of results in the current year with a view to preserving congenial atmosphere in the educational institutions" he said.
