TEXTBOOKS BLUNDERS

Left-leaning organisations submit memo to edn minister

SEVERAL left-leaning organisations on Tuesday demanded immediate withdrawal of textbooks which are ridden with errors and promote prejudiced and worlddiscriminatory view'.

Under the banner Pragatishil Sangathan Samuha, the organisations made their demands through a memorandum to the education ministry.

Several hundred activists held demonstrations in front of the National Muse-

um at Shahbagh in Dhaka and marched towards the ministry parading through Dhaka streets.

Udichi Bangladesh Shilpigoshthi, Bangladesh Juba Union, Bangladesh Chhatra Union, Pragati Lekhak Sangha, Garment Workers' Trade Union Centre and Khelaghar were the organisations that took

part in the demonstrations.
This year, the National Curriculum and Textbook Board distributed around 36.21 crore textbooks containing misspelled texts and controversial graphics and contents - among 4.26 crore primary and secondary level students.

The textbooks were subjected to fierce criticism for inclusion of communal, prejudiced and discriminatory elements and dropping out secular and humanist contents.

The organisations de-manded reinclusion of

humanist write-ups by Rabindranath Tagore, Lalon Shah, Satyen Sen, Ranesh Dasgupta, S Wajid Ali and Humayun Azad, which were dropped out from the textbooks.

The activists also demanded developing a textbook curriculum that aims at enabling children grow up upholding the ideals of humanity, patriotism and universality.

The government which claims to uphold the spirit of the Independence War, has now resorted to unethical means to please religious fanatics and communal groups like Hefazat-e Islam', said Chhatra Union president Lucky Akhter. 'Ayub Khan banned

Rabindranath during the Pakistan period and now the Awami League gov-ernment has dropped his works from textbooks', said sculpture Rasha.

He added that successive governments had failed to introduce an edu-cation policy which was non-communal and hu-

mane. Udichi president Shafi-uddin Ahmed, Chhatra Union general secretary GM Jilani Shuvo, Pragati Lekhak Sangha general secretary Shakhawat Tipu, Sraban Prakashani pub-lisher Robin Ahsan, Juba Union general secretary Hafiz Adnan Riyad, Gar-ment Workers' Trade Union Centre leader Monzur Elahi, among others, spoke reinclusion of at the demonstrations.
