

IU ADMISSION TEST QUESTION PAPER LEAK

Teacher, officers suspended, student expelled

THE authorities of Islamic University in Kushtia on Monday cancelled the F unit admission test under applied science and technology faculty over a question paper leak.

The authorities also suspended a teacher and two officers and expelled a student after an investigation found their involvement in leaking the admission test question paper under its 2016-17 academic year.

The decisions were made at the 233rd syndicate meeting with the university vice-chancellor professor M

Harun-Ur-Rashid Askari in the chair.

The suspended teacher was M Nurul Islam, an associate professor of mathematics department, who had coordinated the unit's admission test, held on December 7 last year.

Saiful Islam, a senior auditor of accounts, and Alaudin, a staff of IU library, were also suspended.

Monojit Kumar, a master's student of mathematics department, was permanently expelled from the university.

The authorities served notices to the teacher and the two officers to explain why

their employments should not be terminated.

An emergency meeting of the university central admission committee will be held on Tuesday to make a decision on fresh admission test.

IU vice-chancellor said that they had taken the decision, after getting the investigation report, so that no one could do such a heinous act in future.

On January 25, the authorities formed a three-member probe body, headed by professor M Mostofa Kamal of mathematics department, to investigate the incident. The probe body submitted their report on March 4.
