STUDENTS of Kalirsthan Junior School in Aditmari upazila were attending their classes under the open sky as the school was damaged by

In a visit on Wednesday, this correspondent saw four schoolteachers imparting lessons to the students at the damaged classrooms amid risks.

The school, still out of

Monthly Payment Order, was running with the financial assistance of the local people and the schoolteachers, said the school authorities.

The nor wester had damaged two out of three classrooms of the school that impacted on the academic activities for around 220 students and teachers, said Md Mökhlechur Raman, headmaster of the school.

The school's assistant teacher Anil Chandra said that the schoolhouse built with wood, bamboo and tin was already dilapidated a few years ago that allowed rainwater into the classrooms during monsoon.

'We are facing problems, especially due to heat and frequent rain as the establishment was damaged due to the nor'wester,' he said.

Abul Kashem, president of the managing committee, said that local parliament member and upazila administrative officials were informed about the situation.

'So far the school did not receive any government assistance for infrastructure development,' Abul added.

The school was established in 2000 and got academic certification in 2011.
