BUET students continue class boycott

THE students of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology boycotted their classes for the fourth consecutive day on Tuesday, demanding that the authorities concerned take effective steps to investigate the attack on Friday night and punish the attackers.

The students also demanded the authorities to ensure foolproof security of the students and file a case against the attackers.

ties to construct two gates area to limit traffic movein Palashi and Bakshibazar ment on the campus. They also demanded removal of a foot over bridge on the campus within 72 hours. They said that the over bridge was a safe haven of the drug addicts. They alleged that some university staff and their family members were involved in the illicit drug peddling.

They said these after staging a demonstration on the BUET campus in the capital.

The students threatened that they would not go back to their class until the authorities take any visible action to ensure punishment of the culprits.

Meanwhile, Dhaka University and BUET authorities formed two separate probe bodies to investigate the incident.

On Friday night, at least a five BUET and DU students were injured in a clash over confining a DU student on BUET campus.
