According to an informed sources, works on 1,438 schools of category I 999 of category 14 and 1919 schools of category III have been completed. Works on remaining 10870 schools are going on

The Government has so far spent Taka 22 crore for the development of these schools, of which Taka 17 crore was spent during the 1976-77 financial year. During the current financial year Taka 5 crore has been spent so far, while another 4 crore Taka is likely to be pumped in .
