

BCL forces Pabna college to stop admission

LEADERS of a Chhatra League faction forced the Pabna Government Bulbul College to stop the HSC admission on Tuesday, the last date of admission, college sources said.

The Chhatra League activists also allegedly assaulted the college principal, the sources said. The district Chhatra League leaders, however, brushed aside the allegations.

The sources said Tuesday was the last date of HSC admission and the authorities had already took students in 1010 out of the 1050 seats from the merit and waiting lists.

The process on Tuesday was going on peacefully until some Chhatra League leaders forced the authorities to stop admission in a move to have at least 150 students of their choice admitted.

When the college authorities did not heed the Chhatra League requests and have students from the merit and waiting lists admitted,

Chhatra League leaders, led by former college students' union vice-president Abdul Aziz, tried to force the authorities, on Tuesday morning to have students of their choice admitted, the sources said.

The admission committee convener, Golam Rahman, said the authorities were compelled to stop the admission process. Forty seats are still vacant.

Admission seeker Md Jahidul Islam, a resident of Khodairpur in the district headquarters, said, 'I have been selected but I could not complete the admission process.'

The Chhatra League men, meanwhile, assaulted the college principal, Syed Anwarul Islam, when he was going home at noon.

Abdul Aziz, however, brushed aside the allegation and said, 'I am not involved with the incident.' The incumbent vice-president of the college student's union, Morshed Ali, said some untoward incidents had taken place because of admission rush.
