ed and buses were burnt.

Chhâtra Dal activists had
exploded cride bombs in entry points to the campuses in the morning and and burnt two buses parked near Jagannath University Jacing Chhatra League resistence.

The Fire Service and Civil Defence said that 'miscreants' had set on fire two minibuses parked the Jagannath University campus about 8:00am. Fire fighters put out the flames.

No one has so far been rrested in this connection, the police said.

Chhatra Dal-leaders on Sunday said that they wanted co-existence of political activists and they tried to enter the campuses on Monday. As they tried to enter the campus, the police said. they exploded a number of crude bombs. A few of the students were injured.
