



JU students submit memorandum to VC

SAVAR, Feb. 7:—A memorandum signed by around 1700 students, teachers and officials of JU was submitted to the Vice-Chancellors for the implementation of their six-point demand including the naming of university's Dairy Farm Gate after late Kawsar Hossain, Associate Professor of English Department who was killed in a tragic road accident on February 1.

The six-point demand includes trial of the driver Sheikh, Char Mia of the bus which ran over Kawsar Hossain coming from the wrong side, construction of road divider from MH Hall Gate to Bishwa Gate, unconditional release of the arrested students, trial of the police responsible for the attack on the students, setting up a mini hospital providing three ambulances.

It may be mentioned here that the medical centre of the university has no ambulance.

Earlier, the students of History Department and the Platform for Resisting the Repression (PRR) today formed a human chain at the foot of Amor Ekushey on the campus to press home their demands.
